To diagnose diabetic eye disease while it is treatable, experts currently suggest that people with type 1 diabetes get an eye exam at least once a year starting three to five years after diagnosis. To find out whether the exam frequency could be tailored to individual risk, researchers analyzed 30 years of data from about 1,400 people with type 1 (insulin-dependent) diabetes.

CONCLUSIONS: More than three-quarters of non-Indigenous Australians with diabetes and more than half of Indigenous Australians with diabetes adhere to the NHMRC eye examination guidelines. The discrepancy between the adherence rates may point to gaps in the provision or uptake of screening services in Indigenous communities, or a lack of awareness of the guidelines.

When previous exams have been normal, subsequent examinations can be done with retinal photographs. A comprehensive examination is required for follow-up of abnormalities detected on retinal photographs. These recommendations are largely consistent with American Diabetes Association (ADA) guidelines .

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
