Description. Undoubtedly the most influential black intellectual of the twentieth century and one of America's finest historians, W.E.B. DuBois knew that the liberation of the African American people required liberal education and not vocational training. He saw education as a process of teaching certain timeless values: moderation, an avoidance of luxury, a concern for courtesy, a capacity to endure, a nurturing love for beauty.

By and large, Woodson found that America's education system didn't—and wouldn't—help black students. This was because, for Woodson, a "good" education was one that helped blacks overcome their unique circumstances as the children of formerly enslaved people, not one that reaffirmed and reinforced a status of inferiority.

What it means to be black in the American educational system

In the 18th century there were no schools in the southern states of America that admitted black children to its free public schools. Fearing that black literacy would prove a threat to the slave system whites in the Deep South passed laws forbidding slaves to learn to read or write and making it a crime for others to teach them.

These pretty much ignored the Northern philanthropists' push for education that denigrated black people and instead set up a web of private schools and colleges that eventually bore fruit. These schools educated at least a few black leaders in the absence of public education and in spite of barriers set up to block such education.
